It was this balanced form of government which, historians agree, contributed so greatly to the success of the Constitution whose 150th anniversary we celebrate this year.

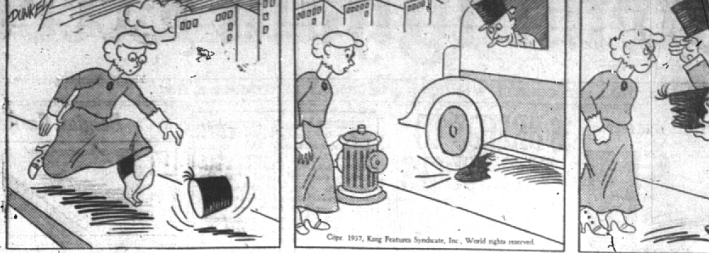
It was this balanced form, with its safeguards for all citizens, which enabled America to make so notable a contribution to the history of human liberty and government, of, by and for the people.

STAR DUST Movie - Radio

SAMUEL GOLDWYN is taking bows again for succeeding where many other motion picture producers have failed.

His picture frankly a tear-jerker, the story of a millionaire's daughter who marries a penniless boy.

Although all of us, the apparatus called the 'lie detector' has been coming into increasing use, not only as a means of establishing the guilt of a suspect, but also as a means of proving an accused person's innocence.

Dr. M. W. Marston, who made psychological studies of falsehoods at Harvard and Columbia universities as far back as 1914, probably was the first to conduct Sigmund experiments with 'lie detectors.'

The mechanics of the lie detector, of much thought and experimentation, are really simple. A tube attached to the subject measures his respiration and another records his blood pressure.

IT IS believed impossible for a man to control these automatic movements. Even if he tries to answer a question put to him, his brain prepared the answer by transmission of these impulses.

Two needles trace the respiration and blood pressure on paper as the test is made. As long as the suspect knows he is telling the truth, an even line is traced across the paper.

Deliberately lying, however, due to the action of secretions from the sweat gland, will cause a distortion in the respiration and blood pressure, the result being a sudden irregularity in a tell-tale line.

The lie detector does not get false confessions by inspiring fear or pain. Rather its value lies in the work of a guilty conscience and the uncontrollable behavior of the glands which exert tremendous influence on human conduct.

Although courts of law have not accepted evidence based on a lie detector test as infallible, hundreds of cases have been decided by the tests.

Gov. Henry Horner of Illinois granted Abe Rappaport, condemned murderer, his request for a lie test. The test was made the very night the doomed man was to be executed.

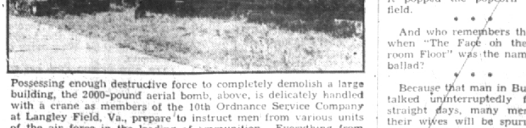

but the cold, remorseless line took a jagged leap. Rappaport was dejected.

Police, suspicious, subjected him to the test. The lie detector indicated Nelson was telling the truth and he was allowed to return to Arizona with attorneys to claim the fortune.

Police in nearly all large cities now have access to lie detector machines. It is the hope of police authorities and scientists that the detectors soon will become universal in use—and above all, accepted as positive evidence of guilt or innocence.
