Creamed Shrimp: Heat 1 can of shrimp in 1 cup of rich cream sauce. When ready to serve, add 1 tablespoon finely chopped parsley and garnish with slices of hard-boiled egg.
Raw Vegetable Salad: 1 cup finely chopped green pepper. 1 cup grated raw carrots. 1 cup finely shredded lettuce. 1/4 pound American cheese, grated—mayonnaise. Mix each vegetable separately with enough mayonnaise to bind. On a leaf of lettuce place a mound of carrots. Place a mound of lettuce on top of carrots and top with a mound of green pepper, sprinkle with cheese. Serve with savory dressing.
