## MAPLES ROSE TO CRANES IN TRACK EVENTS

Although taking six first places and trying for another, Birmingham High School and the Cranes Friday afternoon on the Cranbrook track by the score of 68 to 46. Cranbrook placed second in eight of the events which gave it enough points to more than win the final score.

A new Maple record for the shot put was set when Jack Edmonds won the event with a heave of 38 feet and 1/4 inch. The old record of 37 feet was made in 1933 by Rex Overland. Ross Wolfe, both of Cranbrook, placed second and third respectively.

In both the 120-yard high and low hurdles, Birmingham captured first and third places. Watson took first in both high and low hurdles in both events, and Allen followed suit by placing third in both. Watson's time for the high hurdles was .16 flat for the low, .14 flat.

Stecker, Newcomb, and Roe scored a clean sweep for Cranbrook in the 100-yard dash. Watson's time for the race was 10.8; Roe and Newcomb tied for second.

After establishing a good lead for the entire four laps in the mile run, Hoover added another five points to the Maroon's score when he reached the tape first in 5:7.7. Parker, of Cranbrook, took second and Young, of Birmingham, placed third.

In the 220 the Cranes took another first place in the tape in 24.5. Andrews placed second for Birmingham, and Newcomb, of Cranbrook, took third. Cranbrook gained eight more points as Bird and Olsen ran first and second respectively in the 440-yard dash. Baldwin, of Birmingham, came in third.

On his last chance in the broad jump, Vinton made 19 feet 4 1/2 inches to take first place, out-jumping Stecker, of Cranbrook, by 3 inches. Stecker placed second and third was Estes, also of Cranbrook. Vinton gave the Maroon's five additional points by clearing the bar in the high jump at 5 feet 1 inch. The Cranes took another second and third with Roe and Wilson jumping in that order.

With Quentin Brelsford, of Mansfield, Cranbrook easily placed first in this event. Parker crossed the finish in 2:12.8. However, Birmingham took the other two places with Dalley finishing second and "Mug" Colgrove third.

Cranbrook's 440 relay team, consisting of Stecker, Broadwell, Newcomb, and Bird, came in first to take the relay in 1:41.3. The Maple Leafs and Cranbrook will meet again on the Cranbrook track with five teams Tuesday, May 10.

## BRELSFORD SETS NEW RECORD ON MANSFIELD TRACK

Birmingham's five star trackmen returned from the Mansfield Relays at Mansfield, O., Saturday with all that Coach Whitney had expected—Quentin Brelsford with first place in the half-mile and in which he set a new record for the Mansfield Relays, and George Anwarak, Frank and Betty, Phil Carey, and Frank O'Donnell with plenty of experience. This was the 12th annual Relays held at Mansfield, and it is rapidly becoming one of the largest high school meets in the country. Eighty-six schools, representing six states and numbering over twelve hundred high school athletes, were out on the field Saturday.

It was an ideal day for a track meet, even though it was a little hot for the spectators filling the stands. A fresh, cooling breeze occasionally stirred the top of the field, but the heat of the sun and the track was dry and hard and in excellent shape.

At 10 o'clock the meet began, and Brelsford waited around on the field until 4:30 when his event was run off. It was divided into four heats due to the fact that there were nearly 85 entrants.

Brelsford, running in the first heat, got off to a very poor start, although he was in the next to the inside lane. As he went around the first curve he was pushed back into seventh position when he held till he reached the back stretch. Then he began pulling up into second place as he began his second and final lap, he was with Jack Baker. Pop was all done up in black with sequins.

Coach Whitney thought that the sun might sap Brelsford's strength with 1500 yards to go, but his fears were not realized. Whitney stated that "if Brelsford had gotten off to a good start, he would have held the pole position at the beginning, he might have made it in 1:58."

When Brelsford was informed of Whitney's fears, he said, "When the 80 was run off, I was pretty mad at having to wait around so long, and I told myself I was going to win it. And I'm glad I did."
