

Organist Will Be  
Symphony Soloist

Robert Elmore, brilliant 22-year-old American organist and protégé of Mrs. Truman H. Newberry of Detroit, will be presented as soloist with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra at the season's sixteenth subscription concert in Orchestra Hall Thursday night, Dec. 22. He will be heard in the Saint-Saëns' Third Symphony, in C minor, for organ and orchestra, a work to be played for the first time at these concerts.

The concert will mark the first appearance this winter of Victor Kolar as conductor of a subscription program. In addition to the Saint-Saëns' Symphony, Kolar, who has chosen an especially interesting program, will direct the orchestra in performances of Handel's Suite from "Water-Music," and the Tunc Poem, "Don Quixote," considered by many to be one of Richard Strauss' greatest works.

The entire program will be repeated at the third in the series of seven matinee concerts, at 2:30 p. m., Friday, Dec. 23, in Orchestra Hall.
