Birmingham's Community Christmas Tree is inspiring passersby with the Yuletide spirit every evening now with its gay and colorful lights. The towering Norway Spruce which stands in the civic center is ablaze with the cheerful Christmas colors for the fourth consecutive year. Rising 72 feet, the regal tree is decorated with 304 bulbs shedding 1,400 watts of light. It was in 1934 that Mrs. William R. Law, daughter of the late James Couzens, and the late Senator Couzens, offered to contribute funds needed to purchase the lighting system and electricity for the City's Christmas tree. The equipment was given to the City by Mrs. Law to be used at every Christmas season.

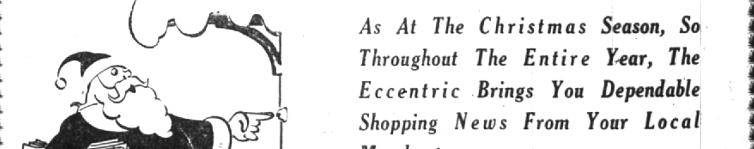
