ROOM with a very low ceiling—such as a basement recreation room—presents a special lighting problem. The lighting fixtures used in a room of ordinary height may hang as much as 12 to 18 inches from the ceiling. These are obviously impractical here

There are three solutions—any or all of which may be used, depending on the size of the room to be lighted. A recessed glass panel almost flush with the ceiling will provide good general illumination, when used in conjunction with other lighting and eliminate any danger of bumping one's head on the usual projecting type of light fixture. Wall brackets are another possibility: Graceful new plastic wall urns are an attractive variation of the usual shaded bracket, and supply a good quality of indirect illumination.
