M., a public hearing will be held in the Commission Room of the Municipal Building, in the City of Birmingham, on the following proposed amendment to Article 3 of Ordinance Number 221, as amended, known as the Zoning Ordinance, and at which time suggestions or objections from any person interested will be heard.

"AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCE The City of Birmingham Ordains:— That Article 3 of Ordinance Number 221 be amended by adding thereto a section to be known as Section 301 (c), said Section 301 (c) to read as follows:—

Section 301 (c) Property described as Part of NW. 14 Sec. 25, T. 2 N., R. 10 E., described as: Beginning at NW. corner said Sec. 25, thence South 889 ft.; thence East 220 ft. to point of beginning of this description; thence South 240 ft.; thence East to a point 300 ft. distant from Woodward Avenue; thence Southeast and parallel to Woodward Avenue to South line of Jewett property; thence East 318 ft. to Woodward Avenue; thence Northwest along Woodward Avenue 932.4 ft.; thence West 413 ft. to point of beginning, is hereby included in Multiple Family Residence District. NOTE:—This proposed change contemplates the utilization of the East 300 ft. of the so-called Jewett property on North Woodward Avenue for Multiple Family Dwellings. IRENE E.
