Dr. Richard H. Morgan, of Wing Lake road, died Sunday morning, July 10, at his residence. He was born June 28, 1881, at Albert Lee, Minnesota, attended public schools in Minnesota, and obtained his degree of Doctor of Medicine at the University of Michigan. After a period of general practice, he began to specialize in the treatment of tuberculosis. He spent several years at the MacGregor Sanitarium in New York, and then came to Detroit in 1927.

At the time of his death, he was a member of the American Medical Association and the National Tuberculosis Society, a member of the staffs of Herman Kettering and Harper Hospitals and the Detroit Tuberculosis Sanatorium, a member of the Wayne County and Michigan State Medical Societies, and a former president of the Uxía, Michigan.

Dr. Morgan is survived by his wife, Mrs. Eleanor Gillett Morgan, of Uxía, and Mrs. Stephen G. Palmer, Jr., of Minneapolis. Funeral services were held at 3 p. m. Monday, July 11, at the Temple of Memories at White Chapel Memorial cemetery, with the Rev. Robert Woodroffe, of Christ Church Cranford, officiating.
