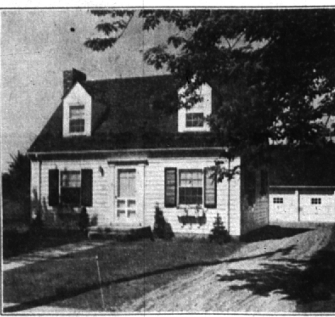

NOVEL ON 'SWING' HEADS NEW BOOKS AT BALDWIN

When the band leader jells "swing it," a modern dance orchestra can produce a combination of sounds and rhythms that most modern of 20th century phenomena is at last described in Dorothy Baker's novel, *Young Man With a Horn*. This is the story of a "swayed" little boy, to the only band his native town afforded, he picked up the rudiments of music. In time he could play the trumpet and eventually made his way to New York where his feverish genius made him a sensation over night. His muse rode him hard; he could neither eat nor sleep—and then he met Amy North, brilliant, severe and demanding. The conflicts that followed make this absorbing story that was awarded the Houghton Mifflin Fellowship award.

LOCAL BUILDING SHOWS DECLINE IN PAST MONTH

Building operations in Birmingham dropped from a total valuation of \$30,410 in April to a total of \$17,250 during the month of May, according to the report submitted to City Manager Donald C. Ebert by Building Inspector J. B. Baynes.

Permits issued for five new single residences in May have a valuation of \$37,000, the report shows. One permit issued for alterations to a residence was valued at \$150 and one for erecting a "scale shed" had a valuation of \$100.

Three working permits for a residence and two barns are also included in the report, as is one permit for the removal of an office building.

The total of \$37,250 for May not only shows a decrease from that for April, but is also under the March total, which was \$51,119.

New Law Results In More Licenses

Figures just released from the Operators and Chauffeurs Division of the Department of State show that more operator licenses have been issued to date than during the same period last year. Up to June 1, there were 38,510 operator licenses issued as compared to 184,250 issued during the first five months of 1937.
