Carl Rupp, Former Resident, Invents Gadget To Eliminate Piano Practice

A pianist, like a motorist, can get along by waiting for the light and then punching it, if he uses the new invention of Carl Rupp, formerly of Birmingham and now of Chicago. A veteran band-leader Rupp calls his gadget the "Piano Master," and claims that its use will take the place of the years of practice ordinarily needed to become even a fair pianist. The "Piano Master" called an "ingenious contraption" by Time magazine in a recent article, saves one as much as an entire piano. A motor-driven player-roll mechanism, which flashes a light beneath the keys, enables the pianist as it should be struck, is substituted for that part of the ordinary machine which normally pressed and released the keys. Whenever the student sees a light he knows that a key is to be struck, according to the theory of the invention, to anticipate the flashings, which longer need the "Piano Master."
