BALLET TO OPEN COMING SEASON FOR TOWN HALL

The Ballet Caravan, a company of 20 young dancers in ballets by and with American dancers and choreographers, American composers, painters and costume designers, will open the Detroit Town Hall 1938-39 series of 20 Wednesday mornings in the Fisher Theatre Oct. 12.

Frank Lloyd Wright, famous architect, will discuss "The Future of Architecture." Elza Max, well known internationally for her bizarre parties, will speak. Vicki Baum, Viennese author of "Grand Hotel" and "Tales of Ball," will talk on "Why Be Afraid?" Stefan Zweig, European biographer whose "Mary of Scotland" and "Marie Antoinette" are current Hollywood productions will discuss "The History of Tomorrow."

Authorities on current events will include Stuart Chase, economist, speaking on Mexico; Sir Ronald Storrs, former military attaché and governor of Palestine, on "The Problem of Palestine"; Eugene Lyons, author of "Assignment in Utopia," speaking on Russia; Mrs. Lillian T. Mowser, wife of Edgar Ansel Mowser, noted foreign correspondent and author, on "Journalist's Wife," discussing the Hitler aggression in Central Europe, and Felix Morley, editor of the Washington Post and Pulitzer Prize-winner for his editorial, "The Economic Crisis," on the subject of "The Economic Crisis."

Capt. John D. Craig, direct from new deep-sea adventures in the West Indies, will return to Town Hall with exciting moving pictures. Capt. C. W. R. Knight, the eagle scout, will present "Leopards of the Air," exclusive moving pictures of the National Geographic Society South African Expedition of 1937.

The Eva Jesse Chair, featured in George Gerstwin's "Pony and Bear" and in Gertrude Stein's "Four Saints in Three Acts," will be a morning attraction.

Dr. Thomas Parran, superintendent of the United States Public Health Service, will speak on "Looking Forward to Public Health." Others will be Jim Tully, on "Behind the Scenes in Hollywood," and Herold Ward, director of science for the New York World's Fair, on "The Science Fair." One other attraction will be announced.

The University of Chicago will speak with Prof. Harry Goldstone and Paul Douglas, noted economists, and the other speaker will discuss the question of "American Foreign Policy—Drift or Design?" Also coming are William Lyon Phelps, speaking on "Books and plays," and Lyman Bryson, professor of adult education at Teacher's College, Columbia U., on "The Art of Living." The Town Meeting of the Air, Dr. Bayson's subject will be "Do Children Need Detroit?" One other attraction will be announced.
