### Changes Announced In State Bus Lines

On May 16, the bus schedules of many of the bus lines serving Michigan will be changed. Schedule changes will provide better connections at many points and in many instances result in increased service. Connection delays are necessary for passengers to change from one bus to another to get to destinations, have been drastically reduced.

One of the most important changes is the new schedule between Eastern Michigan Motorbuses and Eastern Ground Lines, providing four good connections at Kalamazoo for points between Detroit and Kalamazoo to points between Kalamazoo and Benton Harbor and St. Joseph.

Other changes mean better service between points north of Grand Rapids and from points south of Kalamazoo, also between points north of Lansing to and from points west, south and east of Jackson.

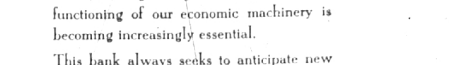
