**SCHOLARSHIPS ARE AVAILABLE FOR LOCAL GIRLS**

Six new scholarships, open only to girls who live outside of New Jersey, will be offered next year by New Jersey College for Women. New Brunswick, N. J. Girls living outside of New Jersey, who wish to enter college in September 1939, may compete for these grants, all of which are renewable from year to year, the College Scholarship Committee announces.

Of the six new scholarships for out of state girls, the largest is the Douglas Scholarship of \$800. There are five new National Scholarships of \$600 each, and three of \$500 each. Awards are made on the basis of character, examinations, financial need and scholarly ability.

March 1 has been set by the Scholarship Committee as the final date by which students may apply for the new scholarships. Complete information on all available scholarships for freshmen may be secured from the Secretary of the Scholarship Committee at the college.

**HINTS TO GREEN HUNTERS ON WHAT TO WEAR ON TRIP**

LANSING, Nov. 10.—If novice hunters who are planning to make their first deer hunting trip this season, will take the advice of veteran hunters, they will avoid wearing heavy clothing.

One of the most common errors on the part of green hunters, is the wearing of heavy clothing. It is advised by conservation officers on their patrol of hunting camps during the deer season, is that of supposing that in order to keep warm one must be weighed down like a freighter. Weight and needless warmth can be had with comparatively light clothing if it is the right kind, the conservation officers point out.

A memorandum for new hunters might include: Clothing that is warm, but light, and loose. Boots that support the arches, or supporters that can be placed in boots that don't—and by all means, boots that are not tight. A cap that has no ear flaps that tie up over the top of the head. The flaps and laces are constantly getting caught in tree and brush branches.

The silver anniversary has been used as the theme of the program, which is enlarged by four pages. This year's issue promises to be the best in the history of the school.

Among the interesting features will be photographs of the 1918 team, and captains, of both schools. An article, "Way Back When," in reminiscent mood, looks back over the quarter century.

Other features and photographs are a story on the "Brown Jug," camera shots of the players, cheer leaders, and P. A. system operators; scores of the past games; a story on football in 1913 and now; line-ups; basketball schedules for the approaching seasons of both schools; and the selection of the all-time all-star team.

Cooperating with Baldwin publications in the preparation of this program are John Baldwin, director of athletics at Royal Oak high school, and Mrs. Peter Puzog, long a resident of Royal Oak. Those from Birmingham assisting with information are Mrs. John H. Rosso, Raymond Peck, and Carl Ely, the two latter having been players in Birmingham's 1913 eleven.

The program will go on sale Wednesday morning, Nov. 23, at Birmingham and Royal Oak high schools and will also be sold by vendors at the game.
