Voters To Settle State Contest for

Executive Office

**Fitzgerald To Speak Here
Friday On His Tour Of
Oakland County**

Michigan voters will go to the polls Tuesday morning to settle with the ballot a gubernatorial contest which has attracted nationwide attention, and to accept or reject four proposed amendments to the State Constitution. They will also elect the state's major state and county officials. A Congressional delegation will be in Birmingham Polls In Five Precincts Equipped To Avoid Delay

Indications point to heavy voting in Birmingham's five precincts at the General Election, Tuesday, when the polls open at 7 a. m., according to city officials. Heavy voting at the Primary, a contest based on party issues for the offices of governor and four proposed amendments to the State

Since the primary in September, when former Governor Frank P. Fitzgerald won the nomination from Harry S. Toy, as the Republican Party's candidate for

governor, interest has centered around his campaign opposing Governor Murphy, seeking re-election.

Mr. Fitzgerald is a Democrat and ardent New Dealer.

Fitzgerald To Speak

Birmingham voters will be given an opportunity to hear Mr. Fitzgerald express his views and qualifications in regard to the coming election. Friday afternoon, he is scheduled to

speech here at 5:30 p. m., from a sound truck, which will be parked at the corner of West Maple and Pierce street. He will be introduced by Mayor John E. Martz. His appearance in Birmingham will be included in a speaking tour of Oakland County, which will begin at 9:30 a. m., with an address

issues in the campaign, the contest between former Gov. **Murphy** and Gov. Fitzgerald. Murphy attracted the attention of the press throughout the country.

The four proposals to be submitted as amendments to the State Constitution appear at the top of the ballot. The first proposes a four year term of office

for the County Clerk, Prosecuting Attorney, Sheriff, Treasurer and Register of Deeds. The second proposed amendment provides for the non-partisan nomination and appointment of Supreme Court

The third proposal asks voters to decide whether the Constitution shall be amended to "guarantee that gasoline and motor vehi-

Because of the social and economic problems involved, the fourth proposal has aroused con-

siderable discussion. It provides
