Boy Scouts To Aid Goodwill Campaign

Plans for the Boy Scouts' Good Turn for Goodwill Day are nearing completion. On Saturday, October 15, the housewife of Greater Detroit will be called upon by a team of two Scouts. They will not collect the contributions of the housewife for Goodwill Industries, but ask permission to have the Goodwill truck stop at the house during the next ten days. If the housewife has nothing to contribute at this time, the Scout will ask to have a Goodwill Bag left, and the housewife can call Goodwill when it is ready to be called for.

Goodwill Industries of Detroit is a non-profit, charitable organization giving employment to aged and crippled, training and employment for handicapped young people. Clothing, household equipment of all sorts, furniture, books and magazines are the "raw materials" at Goodwill. These used articles are brought to Goodwill where they are used and handicapped people employed there clean, repair and re-make them for use again. They then go to Goodwill Service Stores where they are sold for very moderate prices to people who cannot afford to purchase new goods but who want to pay for things they need. The income from these store sales pays wages to those who are employed in the work of reconditioning this merchandise.

WOMEN VOTERS ENDORSE STATE AMENDMENT

The Michigan League of Women Voters has been added to an impressive list of organizations which have endorsed the proposed constitutional amendment to take the Michigan Supreme Court out of politics. The League, at its recent convention at Saginaw, endorsed the amendment by an overwhelming vote. Endorsement has also been received from the executive committee of the Michigan State Grange, Michigan Federation of Women's Clubs, the executive committee of the Michigan State Medical Society, the Board of Commissioners of the State Bar of Michigan, and many other civic, professional and fraternal organizations. The amendment will be number two on the November ballot.

The amendment provides that instead of being nominated by party conventions controlled by

politicians, henceforth candidates for the Michigan Supreme Court, shall be nominated by a non-partisan, judiciary commission composed of three judges, three lawyers and three laymen. The amendment effectively insulates the judiciary commission against partisan influences by requiring:

First—The members of the commission are selected by five independent agencies: the Supreme Court, the circuit court judges, the probate court judges, the governor, and the Board of Commissioners of the State Bar of Michigan. Second—The three year terms of members of the judiciary commission are staggered and no member can serve two successive terms. Third—The lawyer and laymen members of the judiciary commission cannot hold any other political office and not more than two of each group can belong to the same political party.

The amendment further provides that the selection is between nominees for the Court shall be made by the governor rather than by the electorate.
