ELECTORS TO VOTE NOV. 8 ON THREE AMENDMENTS
There will be submitted to the electors at the General Election on Tuesday, November 8, 1938, three proposed amendments and a referendum on Act 257, Public Acts of 1937, which has an act to provide for the transfer of the administration of certain existing state public welfare and relief matters, services and duties to the state department of public assistance, created by Act 257, and to abolish the various state departments, boards, commissions and offices so transferred.

Two hats made for the men in the Gaganay tribe are exhibited. Held in place by two long cords attached to the sides, they are oval in shape with shallow sloping crowns similar to those worn today by a well-dressed lady of fashion. They are trimmed with small pieces of silver wrought into intricate designs.

Indian paintings by Sanford Plummer, a member of the Seneca tribe, form a background for a portion of the Indian exhibit. Mr. Plummer's Indian name is Da-yoo-da-ka-ga-neh. The paintings illustrate various tribal customs, including a bear dance and a face ceremony, which are gradually disappearing from American Indian life.
