Porter, the former Miss Laura Drury of Medford, Ore., and the present resident of Birmingham. She is the niece of B. E. Drury, also of Birmingham.)

On the fourth of August, amidst the tears, flowers and goodbyes of Medford, we boarded a plane for Seattle. The first time in my life that I was not going to see my dear old mother, as you well know, was on this day.

On the 10th, half of Vancouver came down to the dock to wave and bid us good-bye. We left at night—and what a night—with the full moon and the lights reflected in the water.

Our boat was the Canadian S. S. Princess Louise, and what a honey. For three days and nights we just enjoyed ourselves, playing shuffleboard, ping-pong and dominoes.

CRUSADE FOR JOBS GETS 'BIG HAND' FROM MERCHANTS
