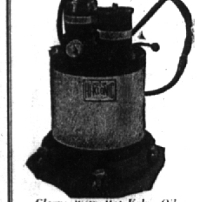

cocktail glasses. Garnish with a sprig of parsley.

#### Tomato Hors d'Oeuvre

Slice tomatoes. Spread each slice with a mixture of mayonnaise and cream cheese. Sprinkle parsley and chopped onion over the top.

#### Bacon and Tomato Shortcake

Cut 8 slices of bacon in 3-inch pieces and cook crisp. Drain on absorbent paper and save the grease. Slice 4 medium sized tomatoes in 1/2 inch slices. Salt and dip in slightly beaten eggs, then in corn meal. Sauté until tender in some of the bacon fat. Make a milk gravy with 3 tablespoons of bacon fat, 3 tablespoons of flour, 1 1/2 cups of milk, and salt to taste. Add crisp bacon to the gravy. Cut sliced bread in circles with a cookie cutter, toast and butter. Place the tomato and potato slices on the bread rounds. Cover with sauce. Serve hot.

#### Tomatoes Stuffed with Spinach

1 1/2 lbs. spinach  
2 tablespoons minced onion  
6 tablespoons French dressing  
6 medium tomatoes  
Lettuce  
2 hard-boiled eggs  
Cook the spinach, drain and cool. Combine with the onion and French dressing and chill ten minutes. Meanwhile, wash and remove the stem end of the tomatoes, then cut each tomato into fourths without cutting all the way to the bottom. Press back the petals to form a pocket. Sprinkle the inside of each tomato with salt, let chill. At serving time heap some of the spinach mixture in the center of each tomato, after arranging the tomatoes on individual beds of lettuce. Garnish with slices of hard-boiled eggs. Serve with any desired dressing.

#### Tomatoes and Salmon

Drain, skin and bone the salmon in a medium sized can. Place on a baking dish. Pour over it 7 fresh tomatoes that have been cooked 20 minutes with 1 teaspoon of onion, 1 tablespoon of chopped green pepper, a little salt and 1/2 teaspoon of sugar. Place strips of bacon on top. Bake in oven 400 degrees for 1-2 hour.

#### Stuffed Tomato Fondue

6 large ripe tomatoes  
1 1/2 cups cooked rice  
1 1/2 lb. American cheese  
1 1/2 cup cream  
1 1/2 cup milk  
Salt, pepper paprika  
Scop out tomatoes and sprinkle with salt. Invert and let stand in the refrigerator for 1-2 hour. Fill the center with rice and bake in an oven 400 degrees for 10 minutes. Cut cheese in small pieces and melt in the combined milk and cream. Add salt, pepper and paprika. Pour around tomatoes and garnish with parsley.

#### Tomato Salad

6 medium sized tomatoes  
1 1/2 cup pickled pearl onions  
1 1/2 cup stuffed olives, chopped  
1 package onion gelatin  
French dressing and mayonnaise  
Peel and remove the inside of the tomatoes, salt and drain. Mix all ingredients and marinate with French dressing. Stuff tomatoes with mixture, invert in tencups, pour gelatin over to cover. When firm serve on lettuce with mayonnaise.

#### Vanity Salad

Arrange crisp lettuce around the edges of a rather large platter and fill the center with heat leaves. On one side lay overlapping slices of tomatoes and on the other side slices of cucumbers. Garnish center with curled celery and watercress. Serve with French dressing, to which crumbled Roquefort cheese has been added.

#### Eggplant with Tomatoes

1 medium eggplant  
4 tomatoes  
2 to 4 tablespoons cooking fat  
2 cup bread crumbs  
2 teaspoons salt-pepper  
Peel the eggplant and the tomatoes. Cut in half-inch slices and dip in the bread crumbs, mixed with the seasoning. Brown on both sides in cooking fat. Place a layer of the browned eggplant on the bottom of a baking dish, cover with one of tomatoes. Continue adding alternate layers until the dish is nearly full. Top with buttered crumbs. Bake in an oven 350 degrees for 20 minutes.
