Exponents of the jam and jive sessions have shown a predominantly classical taste in dance music. Strangely enough, it is this short sighted criticism by loudly denouncing a swing arrangement of that master's incomparable Tocatta and Gigue in D Minor.

And it is not only Debussy who has made the Hit Parade either. There is also Claude Bachy's exquisite piano piece which now all know as "Mc Evers." The great Russian introduced the singularly effective and beautiful tonal harmonies of the French modernist has recently drawn from his Tchaikovsky repertoire the poignant love music from Romeo and Juliet, which bears the Clinton title, "Our Love." The great Russian composer also has another best seller in a number called "No Star Is Lost," which in its original form was a portion of the first movement of the Pathétique Symphony.

Understand, it is not that I condone jazzing up the classics. On the contrary I think they lack all the suave beauty and subtlety of the original form. But what I am saying is that young people like these songs well enough to sing them they should be interested in hearing them as they were originally intended. Those who say that "Back Goes To Town" might not know that this man, perhaps the greatest musician of all times, was not above writing dance music himself.
