Cake Will Make a Whole Dessert and One Which Your Family Will Applaud

Cakes not accompanied by any dairy dessert are sufficient for a whole course. The most important part is the rich filling and elaborate icing. Colored whipped cream and custard, combined with nuts, candies, fruits, jam and jelly, make up the best part of the cake. There are many unworkable icings that are delicious. Try a one-time dessert next time and see what an attractive cake you can make it.

- Fluffy Fingerbread**
 - 2 eggs
 - 3/4 cup flour
 - 2 teaspoons soda
 - 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg or ground spice
 - 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
 - 1 cup brown sugar
 - 1 cup molasses
 - 1 cup buttermilk
 - 1/2 cup butter
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla

Beat the eggs, add sugar, beat 40 seconds, heat until creamy, add nutmeg, shortening, beat well, add vanilla, buttermilk and continue beating. Add sifted dry ingredients. Beat until air bubbles disappear. Stir and bake in two layers. When ready to serve, put cream between layers. Cut in squares, top with whipped cream.
- Berkshire Cake**
 - 4 eggs
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla
 - 1/2 cup flour
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt

Beat egg yolks until thick and lemon colored. Add sugar gradually, heating constantly. Add vanilla and mix well. Fold in flour and salt, alternately with the stiffly beaten egg whites. Pour into two greased layer cake pans and bake in an oven 375 degrees for 20 minutes. When cold spread filling between and on top of cake.

Filling
Melt 1/2 pound of sweet chocolate over hot water. Remove from fire, add egg and mix well. Fold in 1 cup of cream whipped.
- Fairy Cones**
 - 6 egg yolks
 - 3 tablespoons sugar
 - 2 tablespoons flour
 - 1 cup chopped nut meats

Whipped cream, sweetened and flavored.

Beat the yolks of the eggs with the sugar; add the flour, then the nuts. Spread as thinly as possible on greased flat, baking time, Bake about 7 minutes and while still warm cut into squares and roll each in the top of a cone. When ready to serve fill with the flavored and sweetened whipped cream.
- Creole Luff Cake**
 - 1 1/2 cups sifted flour
 - Salt
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1 cup sugar
 - 2 eggs well beaten
 - 2 tablespoons butter, melted
- Creole Butter Frosting**
 - 1 tablespoon cream
 - 2 1/2 tablespoons strong hot coffee
 - 2 cups confectioner's sugar
 - 1 teaspoon vanilla
 - Salt

Mix cream with hot coffee, cream butter, add sugar, salt, coffee and vanilla. Beat until smooth. Spread on cake.
- Prune Layer Cake**
 - 1 cup shortening
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1 egg
 - 1 cup stewed prunes
 - 1 1/2 cups flour
 - 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
 - 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
 - 1/2 teaspoon soda
 - 2 1/2 tablespoons cream
 - 1 tablespoon prune juice
 - 1 tablespoon nut
 - 1/2 cup chopped nuts

Work shortening until creamy; add half the sugar and the prunes, which have been mashed. Add flour sifted with the baking powder, cinnamon and salt, alternately with the soda dissolved in cream, prune juice and milk. Add in one 3/4 cup mixture, followed by a layer of dates, and a thin layer of the crumb mixture on top. Bake 35 minutes in a moderate oven. If desired, serve with whipped cream.
- Date Cake**
 - 1 1/2 cups oatmeal
 - 1 1/2 cups flour
 - 1/2 cup nut meats, chopped
 - 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
 - 1 1/2 cups sugar
 - 1/2 cup butter
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt

Mix all the above ingredients well. Boil 1 package of dates and 1 1/2 cups of water until soft. Put in a flat buttered pan, then a layer of the nut mixture, followed by a layer of dates, and a thin layer of the crumb mixture on top. Bake 35 minutes in a moderate oven. If desired, serve with whipped cream.
