The largest single majority vote for a candidate for state office here was for Supreme Court Justice Henry M. Butzel, who polled 1143 Birmingham votes. Harry G. Kipke, who was swept into office as a member of the Board of Regents of the University, by a 5-1 vote in the State, received 698 votes in Birmingham, falling below his colleague, J. Joseph Horner, who polled 1008. Eugene B. Elliott, G. O. P. candidate for State Superintendent of Public Instruction, defeated his Democratic adversary, T. Thomas Thatcher, by the wide margin of 1135 votes over 111.
