CLEAR GLASS TO REPLACE VENETIAN IN SCHOOL DOORS

Replacing the Venetian glass, new door partitions of clear glass are being installed in two Birmingham schools this week, Baldwin and Adams. The workmanship is being done by the maintenance men of the Board of Education.

Howard D. Crull, superintendent of Birmingham public schools, explained the new plan thus: "The school-board feels that the clear-glass doors will help modernize the school and improve the lighting in the corridors. Teachers no longer have to leave their classes to ascertain the cause of any disturbance in the halls. They can see through the clear-glass doors and tell whether the noise is necessary or otherwise."

According to L. M. Randall, business manager of the Birmingham public schools, the cost of the glass for the doors will come to a total of 36 dollars. The glass for Baldwin high school will cost \$5 dollars and for Adams, 21 dollars.
