Good Puddings Are Delightful Treats When You Wish To Indulge The Family

Everybody with a normal appetite and good taste delights in a perfect dessert. Why not try some of these puddings? They are not difficult to prepare and the results are invariably good.

Orange Marmalade Puffs
1 cup of shortening.
2 cups sugar.
1/2 teaspoon orange flavoring.
2 cups flour.
1/2 teaspoon baking powder.
1/2 teaspoon salt.
1/2 cup milk.

Orange marmalade.
Mix the shortening, add sugar and flavoring, cream until light and fluffy. Sift and measure the flour, salt, baking powder and flour together. Add alternately with milk to the creamed mixture. Beat only until smooth. Beat egg whites until stiff, but not dry, and fold them into the batter. Spread the inside of 6 custard cups generously with orange marmalade and fill the cups half full of batter. Place them in a steamer over boiling water, cover tightly and steam forty minutes. Do not open steamer until the time is up. Remove puddings from custard cups, turn upside down on serving plates. Serve hot with the following sauce:

Apricot Sauce
1 can of apricots.
Juice of 1 lemon.
1/2 cup cream.
1 tablespoon corn starch.
2 tablespoons of honey.
Rub the apricots through a coarse sieve and mix with the juice. Mix cornstarch with water and add to the puree, add honey and cook until thickened. Serve hot on puddings.

Cocoa Pudding
2 cups milk.
1/2 tablespoon gelatin.
1/2 cup cocoa.
1/2 cup sugar.
1/2 cup flour.

Film Folk

"Kalinka" is to be filmed some time this summer with Nelson Eddy and Jeanette MacDonald taking the principal parts. Charles Chaplin, despite protests of some of the big companies, is proceeding with his plans to ridicule the dictators in his picture, "The Dictator." Sidney Chaplin, his brother, has come over from Europe, where he has been for the last ten years and will act as co-director on the scheduled film. Charles Chaplin is to play the dual role of tramp and dictator in the picture and Paulette Goddard is expected to take the feminine lead.

Pickwick Pictures

Lester Cowan who is at present producing "You Can't Cheat An Honest Man" with W. C. Fields' plans to go to London next summer and arrange for the screening of "The Pickwick Papers." Rudy Vallee and Don Ameche will support Sonja Henie in her next picture. Irving Berlin will prepare the musical score and write six songs for the film which will be based on the novel, "Heart Interest."

Jane Gaylor

Jane Gaylor, her mother and Gilbert Adrian, sailed on a fruit liner, recently, for Jamaica. Miss Gaylor and Adrian denied that they were married. They will be away for several weeks. It is reported that Cosmopolitan picture has an agreement with 20th Century-Fox to make six pictures a year, two of which will feature Marion Davis. Cosmopolitan who had been affiliated with Warners for three years, broke with that company when they refused to star Miss Davis in any further pictures.

Wide Variety

This is the second picture Raft has refused to play in during the past six months. The first one was "St. Louis Blues," in which Lloyd Nolan was substituted. Mr. Nolan will also replace Mr. Raft in this last picture.
