

W. P. A. GRANT GIVEN APPROVAL FOR TRACT INDEX

Rep. George A. Dondero has received word from the Works Progress Administration that Proj. O. P. 665-51-177, carrying an allotment of \$33,825, sponsored by Register of Deeds for Oakland County, has been designated as acceptable for inclusion in the P. A. program. The project provides for the reindexing of the tract index of Oakland County and will include indexing the legal descriptions of each parcel of land in Oakland County conveyed or encumbered by recorded instruments in the office of Register of Deeds McQuaid and cover the name of the grantor or mortgagee, date of the instrument and of the recording; the liber and page in which such instruments are recorded; the particular quarter section and section, town, and range, if description is given by metes and bounds; the number and plot and bounds; if in a city or village; etc. The sponsor will maintain the records after completion of the project.

According to F. C. Harrington, Administrator, this project is now eligible for operation at the discretion of the State Works Progress Administrator and his decision will be governed largely by the availability of certified relief labor of the types and skills required, and other considerations that may be important in the state or county.

COMPETITIVE EXAM FOR COAST GUARD SET FOR JUNE 14

In a letter to Rep. George A. Dondero, Rear Admiral R. R. Wasscher, U. S. Coast Guard, announces that a competitive examination will be held for the appointment of cadets to the United States Coast Guard Academy on June 14.

This is a strictly competitive examination open to all boys throughout the United States between the ages of 17 and 22 who can meet the necessary requirements. Successful completion of four years of cadetship leads to a commission in the U. S. Coast Guard.

The Coast Guard Academy offers a well rounded course, well in excess of that ordinarily necessary for a Bachelor of Science degree from a civilian institution. Pay of a cadet while undergoing instruction is \$780 a year plus a subsistence allowance. Those interested may obtain complete details by writing Rep.
