(Continued from Page 1) To frustrate it. This belief it seems to me is essential today. Men have lost faith in the belief that all things are possible to man. Our boasted modern age which has given us such mighty power unknown to other ages, has also witnessed the collapse of civilization to such a degree as to make all who are serious in mind, to doubt that we could build a permanent structure of civilization which will approximate a Christian civilization.

With the tools men share they accomplish mighty tasks. But the same tools that build, become in their hands the instrument of destruction to a mighty degree. The aircraft for example that makes possible one of the greatest accomplishments of the human race, is at the same time of its triumphs of speed and efficiency, becoming the most feared weapon to destroy civilization, and its reign of death so far as helpless civilians are concerned. It is in control. God moves with an evidence of control which is matchless. Men must learn that secret if they would be the inheritors of that power to accomplish definite results.

The life which has no control beyond a momentary incentive will never build a permanent structure. Indeed the greatest demand today in the life of men is that of control of the power that is his. Power—political, social, economic, would make all things possible to men, if they had the control that God has.

The secret for men then is to put God at the center of their lives and their civilization. If they work and their efforts are to become constructive and permanent. The tragedy of the Christian life is the lack of control that uses the fine qualities of personality to destructive ends. It wrecks every personal virtue, every degree of righteousness and ends in a collapse of the Christian personality eventually. So also is this true, in the building of a world of Christian order. With the lack of control the entire social order is wrecked by the men who lack the control to sustain their holy impulses and their righteous endeavor.

Our age has not put God at the center of its life, and it must have if we are to be the masters of our material universe. This is the great contribution which Christianity is to make to a world, namely, the discovery of that power which put at the center of its individual and social life will make all things possible. Such control will make all things of permanent constructive value, and in the end prove to be a blessing to all.

(Continued from Page 1) residence telephones only, although officials state that certain rates will be made in business rates later.

Included in these reductions, are many telephones in Bloomfield Hills and other nearby areas that are connected with the local central office.

Each of the 10 suburban units exchanges shown on the map accompanying this article is a unit. So is each of the seven zones in Detroit unit, for purposes of toll charges to the suburban units, or long distance charges in a 10-mile radius from downtown.

The suburban toll charge, except where the subscriber takes a flat rate option, is 5 cents for a five-minute call for each unit traveled. If you are downtown (Zone 1 on the map) you are three units away from Birmingham. Your toll, therefore, will be 15 cents under the new order, the same as it now is.

However, if you are calling from Zone 2, 3 or 4 in Detroit (see map), you are only two units from Birmingham, and pay only 10 cents to telephone Birmingham. If your call to Birmingham is from Trenton, you are five units distant and pay 25 cents.
