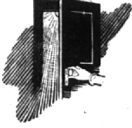

Yanks Lead Way as Sports of 1938 Swing in Review

By IRVING DIX ROUNDTUP the high spots of sports in 1938:

Baseball: New York Yanks swept to their third straight American League pennant and conquered the Chicago Cubs in four straight in the worst series. Johnny Vander Meer smashed the entire sports world by pitching two consecutive no-hit games against the Braves and Dodgers respectively. Hank Greenberg hit 58 homers to miss Babe Ruth's record by two. Bob Feller pitched in Detroit Tigers in one game to set a new major league pitching record. Jimmy Foss led the American League in batting and Ernie Lombardi the National. Joe Gordon, Yank second baseman, was the outstanding rookie of the year. Football: Our four major teams wound up their regular seasons undefeated and untied—Duke, Texas Christian, Tennessee, and Oklahoma. Carnegie Tech sprang the greatest upset by downing until then undefeated Pittsburgh. Referee Tom Getchell was credited with the season's biggest officiating blunder when his "shoot-down" decision paved the way for Notre Dame's victory over Carnegie Tech. Davey O'Brien, "Everybody's All-American," was crowned the football player of the year. Tennis: Don Budge won the American, British, French and Australian singles championships and led the United States to a successful defeat of the Davis Cup. Alice Marble won the American women's title. Golf: Helen Guldahl repeated in the National Open. Patty Berg won the women's title. Atlantic Ocean crossings captured the British Amateur, and Willie Turnesa the National Amateur. Boxing: Joe Louis' revised 1938 defeat by Max Baumbach, known as the German heavyweight in one round at Yankee Stadium. Henry Armstrong became the first man ever to hold three world titles at the same time.
