Besides Being Rich in Three Vitamins,  
Tomatoes Are Favorites in Most Families

Tomatoes contain three vitamins—A, B and C—in better proportion than supplied by any other food and in such a state that their value is unchanged when cooked. As well as being beneficial to our health the tomato with its delicious flavor and cheerful color contributes generously to our meals.

## Tomato Juice Cocktail

Season the required amount of tomato juice with salt, pepper, cayenne and onion juice. Pour into a refrigerator tray and freeze, stirring every half hour. Before serving, beat with a fork and put in cocktail glasses. Garnish with a sprig of parsley. Serve with the following appetizer.

Whip 1-3 cup of cream or evaporated milk, add 1 tablespoon horseradish,  $\frac{1}{2}$  apple, scraped. Drop a teaspoonful in a slice of dried beef. Roll up. Freeze in the refrigerator.

## Tomato Hors d'Oeuvre

Slice tomatoes. Spread each slice with a mixture of mayonnaise and cream cheese. Sprinkle parsley and chopped onion over the top.

## Tomatoes Stuffed With Corn

Peel 6 large tomatoes. Cut off the tops of the tomatoes and remove the centers. Brush the inside of each tomato with highly seasoned French dressing and allow to marinate 15 minutes. Meanwhile measure 3 cups of cooked corn cut from cob. Add 2 tablespoons finely minced green pepper and  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup of mayonnaise. Fill the tomatoes with the corn mixture, top with a stuffed olive and serve lettuce. Garnish with stuffed eggs.

## Porcupine Tomatoes

Peel firm ripe tomatoes and chill thoroughly. With a sharp pointed knife cut slits every quarter inch around the tomato, then insert a piece of cucumber and insert. Cover with mayonnaise, seasoned with onion.

## Tomato Farci

Remove a slice and hollow the center of 9 tomatoes. Combine  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup sliced mushrooms, 3 tablespoons each of bread crumbs, of minced onion, of chopped parsley, with 6 tablespoons of melted butter, 2 teaspoons of salt,  $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon of pepper and 1 teaspoon of anchovy paste. Heap the mixture in the center of each tomato, sprinkle with bread crumbs and paprika. Bake in an oven 350 degrees until tender.

## Fried Green Tomatoes

Slice green tomatoes  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch thick. Dip in seasoned corn meal and saute in hot shortening until brown on both sides.

## Tomatoes and Salmon

Drain, skin and bone the salmon from a medium sized can. Place in a baking dish. Pour over it 7 from tomatoes that have been cooked 20 minutes with 1 teaspoon of onion, 1 tablespoon of chopped green pepper, a little salt and  $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon sugar. Place strips of bacon on top. Bake in an oven 400 degrees for 1 hour.

## Creamed Tomatoes and Cheese

3 large tomatoes.  
4 tablespoons fat.  
3 tablespoons flour.  
1  $\frac{1}{2}$  cups milk.  
1 teaspoon salt.  
Pepper.  
6 tablespoons grated cheese.  
Hard boiled eggs.  
6 slices buttered toast.  
Parsley.

Wash, stem and cut the tomatoes in halves crosswise. Dip in seasoned flour, then saute in the hot fat until golden brown on both sides and tender. Arrange on toast in the center of a platter. Then add the flour to the fat left in the skillet, stir until smooth and add the milk gradually and the salt, pepper, while stirring until smooth. Add the eggs which have been shelled and sliced and when hot pour over the tomatoes. Garnish with parsley and serve.

## Cabbage and Tomato Relish

2 cups finely shredded cabbage.  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup French dressing.  
1 cup unpeeled diced tomatoes.  
Chill diced tomatoes and shredded cabbage in different bowls. Combine and marinate in French dressing 30 minutes before serving.

## Tomato Surprise

Allow  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch slice of bread for each person. Spread with mayonnaise. Place a thick firm slice of tomato on bread. Salt it and spread thinly with mayonnaise. Then lay a thin slice of sweet pickle on tomato.

Meanwhile, mix the following:  
1 cup grated cheese.  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  cup of finely chopped green pepper.  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup finely chopped celery.  
Finely chopped onion to suit the taste.

Spread thickly over the tomato and bread. Place in an oven 400 degrees and leave until cheese is melted. Sprinkle with paprika.
