Safety Groups Plan State-Wide Confab In May

Proponents of safety in public, industrial, home and social life will assemble at the Book-Cadillac hotel in Detroit, May 22 and 23 and 24, to attend the numerous sessions of the Michigan State-Wide Safety conference.

According to C. E. Wormuth, executive secretary, more than 5,000 delegates will assemble from the middle-western states and Canada for the three-day conference. H. M. Tainferro, Grand Rapids, is general chairman of the conference executive board, while A. C. Marshall, Detroit, C. C. Carlton, Lansing, and R. P. Foley, Detroit, are vice-chairmen. Frank J. Morrison, Detroit, is vice-chairman in charge of program.

Mr. Wormuth, manager of the Detroit Industrial Safety council, is executive secretary and managing director and E. Ross Parry, manager of the Grand Rapids Safety council, is assistant secretary. Hoyt L. Fracher, Detroit is treasurer.

The conference program will be broken down this year into five distinct divisions. The Street and Highway division is headed by Richard Harfst, manager of the Automobile Club of Michigan, and Capt. Casavola, of the Michigan State Police. The Industrial Safety division is headed by George Opp, safety engineer, Detroit; Public Safety Educational division by M. P. Cochran, traffic engineer, City of Detroit; School Safety division, by Warren Bow, assistant superintendent of schools, Detroit; Home Safety division, by Margaret Hartnack, Grand Rapids.

John F. Phillips is exhibit chairman; Thomas L. Starr, publicity chairman, and L. E. Cannon, registration and reservation chairman.

Preliminary meetings have been held in Detroit and Lansing and a program which will be radically different and more beneficial to the conferees, from those held in the past, will be completed within the next 30 days.
