BALDWIN TO PLAY YALE FOR DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP

The Baldwin high school basketball team took the first hurdle in its contest for state honors as it easily defeated an unsteady Rochester squad 16-17 last Friday night at Oxford, earning the right to meet Yale, Michigan for the District championship.

Playing a good, sure game in the first half, the Birmingham lads led 12-2 at the end of the first quarter and 20-6 at the half. The tempo of the game changed somewhat in the third quarter as Birmingham speeded up play and raised the score to 10-10. In the final quarter Birmingham scored eight points while Rochester connected for seven points.

Birmingham's added height under the basket proved exceptionally helpful as it placed a man on each side of the basket and used Gilbert controlling the ball off the backboard. Gilbert and McDonald proved exceptionally adept at following up on fouls.

A total of 39 foul shots were attempted, Rochester being successful only five of a possible 18 and Birmingham completing nine of 17 attempts. Rochester lost the services of one man through fouling, Clark being put out of the game on four personal fouls.

John McDonald led the scoring for both teams, connecting for five field goals and one foul shot for an 11 point total, while Rosenquist of Rochester ranked second with five field goals for ten points. Gilbert controlled the ball off the backboard for an eight point total for third place.

Rochester's scoring was all done by three men. Rosenquist scored ten points, Lee scoring four points, and Hunt scoring three points. Birmingham's scoring was divided up, ten of the twelve players having a hand in the scoring.

Coach Whitlow is carrying a squad of twelve men in play, having added Hugh Mack and Julian Felner to the list. All twelve players saw action against Rochester.

The whole Birmingham team played good ball, while Rosenquist stood out for Rochester.
