

## Board Plans Canvass to Aid Registration

### House-to-House Method Will Assist in Reaching All School Eldest

Because only 225 qualified elec-

District have registered to vote in the school election June 12, the Board of Education authorized Superintendent Howard D. Crull Tuesday evening, to make plans for a house-to-house registration plan.

Assistance in conducting the canvass for registration has been requested of the Parent Teacher Associations and of the Birmingham League of Women Voters which previously volunteered to aid in such a plan. Representatives of these groups will meet

The fact that so few qualified electors have registered to date has been attributed to misunderstanding. It has come to the attention of school officials, that many persons are confusing registration for school elections with the registration for municipal elections.

"The Board wishes to notify every qualified school elector that there is no relation between registering for municipal election and registration for school election."

Only those who have registered on or before June 3 will be eligible to vote in the annual school election June 12. Registration

now in progress for qualified electors of the Birmingham school district. This registration applies only to school elections and has no connection with city or state elections. It will form the basis for permanent registration records for the district.

Those eligible to vote are all property owners and parents or guardians of children of ages included in the school census.
