

Prize Drama To Be Presented In Ann Arbor

The third week of the 1939 Ann Arbor Dramatic Season, beginning Tuesday, May 30, presents Whitford Kane in "The White Steed" by Paul Vincent Carroll. This play was awarded the 1939 Critics' Circle prize for the best play by a foreign author. The first release of it outside New York has been made to the Ann Arbor season, and the director there has engaged the distinguished Irish actor, Whitford Kane, to play the role of the Canon. Mr. Kane created this part on tour.

The story of "The White Steed" has to do with the turmoil created in a small Irish village when the old canon has to give up his active care of the parish and a new young priest, who cares more for the letter of the law than for the spirit behind it, undertakes the job of watching over the canon's flock.

A charming love story runs through the play, and there is much humor and a little pathos, as well as characters of rugged individuality.
