ORDINANCE NUMBER 256
 THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM.
 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCE.
 That Article 3 of Ordinance Number 223, amended by adding thereto a new section 301 (a) to read as follows:
 Section 301.
 "Property described as Lots 1379 to 1392 inclusive of Leitch's Birmingham Boulevard Avenue Subdivision, Lots 1, 2, 3 and 4 of Lincoln Trust Company Addition and Lots 12 and 14 of Grove Addition shall be changed from residential classification of B-1 to District of Business Residence District. Properly described as Lots 2 to 14 inclusive of Grove Addition shall be changed from its present classification of Residential District to Business Residence District.
 This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon publication after the passage of this Ordinance by the Commission of the City of Birmingham this 15th day of November, A. D. 1939.

RESOLUTION OF CITY COMMISSIONERS
 WHEREAS, we are advised that it is the desire of the Michigan Highway Department to establish a 45 mile per hour speed limit on Hunter Road, also designated U. S. 10, and
 WHEREAS, there have been a total of 12 accidents reported on this section of U. S. 10 and there have been several minor accidents, which have not been reported;
 WHEREAS, it is the sentiment of the Commission that certain steps should be taken to make this section of U. S. 10 a safe highway and that it is necessary to make proper provision for the safe passage of traffic over the limit suggested; and
 WHEREAS, this section of U. S. 10 is so located that it is intersected by many of the local and through streets and it is necessary to make proper provision for the safe passage of traffic over the limit suggested;
 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION THAT THE Michigan Highway Department be and is authorized to make the following provision for the safe passage of traffic over the limit suggested:
 1. That the speed limit be designated as an absolute speed limit and not a maximum speed limit.
 2. That the State Highway Department cooperate with the City of Birmingham to provide financing for the highway adequate to secure proper drainage of this section of U. S. 10.
 3. That a study be made of the two intersections of this section of U. S. 10, U. S. 10 with Woodward Avenue and the intersection of said U. S. 10 with Oakland Avenue, with a view of improvement of said sections of U. S. 10.
