

Father Reveals Secrets of How He Raised Son

When Father breaks down and Tells All about bringing up his son, there is a sure for the rest of us to sit up and take notice. From behind the evening paper, Father manages to take quite a good deal of what goes on around him and being not un-intelligent he often draws some conclusions that might astonish and delight the child psychologists. Unusually however fathers are too busy to talk about themselves with their offspring; it remained for Frederick Van de Water to write Fathers are Fussy and bare the secrets of a father's heart with a vengeance.

Belligerent and iconoclastic, Mr. Van de Water attacks some of the most ancient and hoary ideas about the father-son relationship, beginning with the "sentimental hokum about Father and son being splendid pals." He reports ruefully that the whole job of being a Father is a combination of "adventure blindman's buff, guerrilla warfare and crossword puzzle." He traces the history of his career as a father from the first harrowing moments in the ante-room of the maternity ward down through the ordeals and problems of table manners, religion, swimming, music, sex and modern education. Writing in a jocular vein, there is an undertone of criticism of a thought that makes this almost required reading for fathers and mothers.

The Gist of Art, by John Sloan. One of the foremost artists of the American school, whose canvases, galleries and private collection, John Sloan sets forth as much of his understanding of art as is possible in the written word. The book is illustrated with reproductions of his own paintings.

American Saga, by Marjorie Barstow Greenbie. A different kind of American history. This is the story of America in the terms of the "American dream of a better life." There are no dates in this book, nor is there much about treaties and politics. History of the country is given enough to record of the people themselves. The things they enjoyed, the things they ate and drank, the clothes and amusements, the whole fabric of their daily lives, make up a history of the country that is most vivid.

Strife Before Dawn, by Mary Schumann. From 1764 to 1782 the rich land between Pennsylvania and Fort Detroit proved a strong lure to settlers. Almost before they could accustom themselves to the wilderness, the Pontia hordes were swooping down upon them and strife and horror were the order of the day. Against such a background is the story of Keith Maffian and his young wife, Hope, of her half-Indian son, and of Jacqueline, the Virginian.

Restless is the River, by August Williams Dethlefs. A historical novel, concerned with the adventures of Augustin, Count Bromgar, political exile from Hungary, his flight to America and how he established a new home in Wisconsin. Less adventurous and more poignant is the story of his wife, Eleanor, torn from the luxury and brilliance of Hungarian court life and terrified by the wildness of the new country.

Another Cynthia, by Doris Leslie. A period piece, purporting to be based upon the diary of one Lady Fulkes who survived some amazing adventures in the 18th century.

The Oweley Inn, by Joseph Lincoln. A New England mystery novel, the County of Oweley, a place of a peaceful book, a hurricane, a shipwreck and a murder are only some of the ingredients.
