Announcement of the luncheon speaker for the Community Institute which is to be held at the Community House Nov. 8 was made this week by Mrs. Cleveland Walcutt who is acting as chairman of this program which is being sponsored by the American Association of University Women.
William John Norton, social worker, and at the present time connected with the Children's Fund of Michigan, will address the group planning on convening for this, the first Community Institute in Birmingham.
Mr. Norton, who was born in White-Head Island, Me., received his bachelor's degree in 1908 from Bowdoin College in Brunswick, Me., and took his L. L. D. degree from Wayne University in Detroit in 1924. He was a social settlement worker in Brooklyn, N. Y., and in Cleveland, O., and lectured in sociology at Western Reserve University in Cleveland and at the University of Michigan from 1924 to 1929.
The groups in the morning session will take up the problems of community improvement, education, county welfare work, tax assessment and volunteer service. The afternoon groups will discuss local welfare work, organizations of clubs, tax collection, domestic help and vocational problems.
Recommendations have been made for the leaders to head these groups and it is expected that the entire list will be announced in the near future.
