A harpist to the right of the so-called string section and piano of heavy brown paper sits at the left of the intriguing conductor who is mounted on his own small podium. The piano, Mrs. Woolfenden pointed out, proved somewhat of a problem for it took two tries before the keyboard and the rest of the piano would meet. A very complicated pattern was used for the piano.

Each member of this small orchestra, with the possible exception of the conductor and the men in the percussion section is seated on his own individual chair. The men who stand, however, have a tall which helps to support them on their pedal extremities.

The orchestra, although practically a complete one, doesn't quite assume the proportions of a large symphony as one of Mrs. Woolfenden's pupils pointed out recently. The ambitious student pointed out that the rest of the violinist whereas the Detroit Symphony has 16.
