Ray A. Palmer

Mr. Palmer, of 720 East Maple Avenue, is a realtor. He was elected to the Commission in April, 1936 and re-elected in April of this year. Prior to his election to the City Commission, Mr. Palmer for many years was a member of Birmingham's Board of Education, and also served as its presiding officer.

Mr. Kane, of 707 Purdy Street, is a salesman for the Minnesota Mining and Manufacturing Co. He was appointed to the Commission to fill a vacancy in September, 1933. He was re-elected in 1934 and again in 1937. Mr. Moody, of 253 Chesterfield Road, is an assistant factory manager for Yellow Truck and Coach. He was first elected to the Commission in April, 1936. Mr. Hulbert, of 680 Brown Street, is an executive of the Detroit Sulphite, Pulp, and Paper Co. He was first elected to the Commission in May, 1927, for a two-year term. He was re-elected for two-year terms in 1929 and 1931, but was defeated for re-election in April of 1933. He was appointed to the Commission in December, 1933, to fill a vacancy and was re-elected for three-year terms in 1934 and 1937.

He was re-elected for a two-year term in 1933, for a three-year term in 1935, and again in 1938 for a three-year term. He was elected mayor pro-tem in 1936, and was re-elected mayor pro-tem in each succeeding year.

Mr. Egbert, of 620 Frank Street, is City manager. He was appointed to this office in December, 1936. Mr. Egbert is one of the youngest City Managers in Michigan. He is appointed by the City Commission, and directly responsible to them for the conduct of his office.

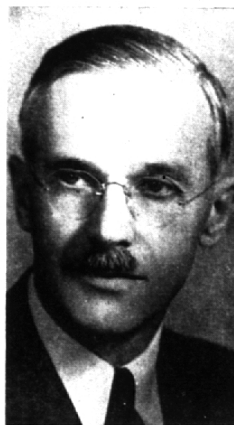
City Clerk
