The moment to plant peonies is almost past. However due to the almost complete absence of rain all perennials have been slow to start their fall growth.

In buying peonies remember that: It is better to buy a three or four-year plant with three or five eyes (new shoots from the root) than an older clump.

Do not use manure near the roots—bonemeal in the answer. If you have peonies, work in a little bonemeal about the plants now. Do not disturb them if you can avoid it.

The "lesser" bulbs are well worth cultivating. Now is the time to plan that lift you are going to get from the first crocus.

As soon as most people buy a home and start a garden, they begin to remember that peonies are loved in the garden of their old home.

If you plant them in the sun, prepare the place they are to grow so that there is good drainage and proper fertilization.

Peonies should never be planted in the spring but that is the time when many gardeners begin to think about planting.

Peony roots may be planted from the middle of August until the first of September.

One of the most satisfactory things you can do is to read the fact that if you look over the catalogues carefully you will find the names of each variety.

Many gardeners, myself included, have become much interested in the more recent single peonies, which are so graceful growing in the garden and much more useful to my mind for picking.

Start this fall and plant at least one Festiva Maxima and begin your enjoyment of this easy and delightful plant.

B'ham Archers Looking Ahead To Deer Season

With their semi-annual shoot finished, several Birmingham archers are looking forward to the next major event on the bow and arrow calendar—deer hunting in the north woods. About 15 from Birmingham and Highland Park are expected to make the trip to the Ogemaw game preserve in November.

Dean Firth and Bob Hubbert, of Birmingham, went on a scouting trip to the hunting grounds recently and counted 80 deer, leading them to believe that a good hunt is in the offing.

Eighty-three archers from Detroit, Toledo, Kalamazoo, Fenton, Eaton Rapids, Birmingham and other points met at the city park near the diamond plant last Sunday for the Michigan Archers Association tournament. Fred Bear (compared to the 12- to 15-pound average) scored 400 out of a possible 500 to top the scoring in the individual shooting event.

Many archers declared it was the toughest course over which they had ever completed. Hilly terrain, goldenrod and other vegetation made it difficult to judge the bulge target, and figures of birds and animals placed along the firing course.
