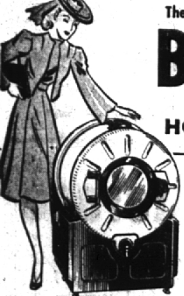

At the regular annual organizational meeting of the City Commission, Commissioner Martz was elected Mayor. Commissioner Hayscock was elected Mayor pro tem and Elmer Haack, Luther Heacock, David Levinson, Robert McClellan and E. W. Osborne were appointed supervisors.

That bills in the amount of \$28,226.01 be confirmed. Accounts payable in the amount of \$2,198.86 ordered paid. Resolutions in the amount of \$1,736.22 were authorized.

That the resolution concerning teachers who marry as adopted by the Board of Education on June 7, 1934 be retained, but that the Board of Education reserve the privilege to retain or to hire exceptional teachers who marry during the term of their contract or who are already married, provided such a recommendation is made by the superintendent of schools.
