The teacher's attention. In my work with the Michigan State Employment Service I contact hundreds of young people out of work; their stories are tragic. I believe that something was missing in their school contacts—something that ought to have been given them to make them capable of self-reliance and ability to find some manner of job.

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Chapman Outlines Guidance Aims

Speaking before the P.T.A. Council last Wednesday night Lloyd G. Chapman, High School faculty member, outlined objectives for student guidance work:
One of the most important points emphasized was that the personal work extended to all phases of the development of youth—social, physical, emotional, economic, moral, as well as educational and vocational. Aptitude tests are helpful and significant, he said.

Later in the program Mr. Averill briefly summarized the discussion regarding discipline and asked: "In order to show the faculty members present how you feel upon the enforcement of more fair but firm discipline in Baldwin High School, please raise your hands if you favor such a move."

Character Training
Last of the panel members to present her viewpoint was Mrs. W. CLETON RANDALL, who said, in part: "As a former teacher upon the subject of personal guidance for students, I believe that such a program ought to stress the value of character education. I believe that such a program should emphasize the duties and responsibilities of good citizenship; and I think that students are also in need of obtaining outside-of-family

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advice upon some of their personal problems. Often the family circle is too limited in its ability to offer practical helps to vexing problems of youth. Knowledge without character values to balance it may prove dangerous to the individual and to society, as many examples prove all about us. Parents and teachers should come together to determine how and how far a character education program should go. The influences of 50 years ago, in the home, are not with us today; there are too many outside distractions that gain the attention of youth; the home has ceased to be the influence it once was, and so has the church.
