Luther Heacock, who lives on Ann street, told his fellow Commissioners that he would be following are the three plans outlined by City Manager Donald Crill, available to a group of residents who subscribe: PLAN I Asphaltic road oil applied to existing surface pricing as a dust preventative, although several streets so treated last year have stood up very well through the winter.

PLAN II This plan will result in a much better street although the cost over a period of years will not be much, if any, greater than for Plan I. It includes the regrading of the street so that it drains properly, and adding the proper depth of gravel. Every year for three years, asphaltic oil would be applied, and the fourth year a soil coat of gravel, bituminous material and crushed stone, making a road which should last for many years.

PLAN III This plan is identical with Plan II, but it includes a curb and gutter, the extra cost of curb and gutter has been estimated at 28 cents per front foot.
