LANSING—With the price of white and Norway pine seedlings cut 20 per cent to \$4 a thousand, the Lansing office of the state forestry department's forestry division is now accepting orders for fall delivery.

Once the ground is prepared, the surface must be raked and loose sods removed. Sow the seed on a still day, allowing 3 to 4 pounds per 1,000 square feet.
