Effectiveness of the overtime work is shown in the decline of Pontiac's unfilled orders from 20,413 on October 31 to 15,532 on November 30.

Former Berliner Tells Experience In Hitler's Reich

The third number of the Cranbrook-Kingswood lecture course was given in the main auditorium Wednesday evening with Gregor Ziemer, a former resident of Berlin, Germany, as the attraction.

Starting in the American Embassy, a school was founded by Mr. Ziemer and on closing, there was an approximate attendance of 100. The controversial subject of Hitler was the thesis of the evening conversation and it was apparent that Hitler and Mr. Ziemer were not friendly toward each other. In speaking of the time of Hitler he spoke of the loyalty of Hitler to those who had helped him attain his objectives.

The greatest weapons of the Germans were not guns, armaments, or planes but the schools. The government has a charge of the thinking processes of the youngsters at the age of six and they are taught that the Germans to do for their country.
