

Snow May Upset Budget Allowance

If this snow continues, it will upset the city's budget for snow and ice control, City Manager Donald C. Egbert admitted Wednesday. However, the weather man like the New Deal—strike out that last crack for the election is over—the weather man is no respecter of balanced budgets.

This year's budget provides \$2,040 for snow removal. Last year, \$2,163 was spent.

Second Scavenger Sale Under Way

The second scavenger sale now being held at the Masonic Temple building, Pontiac, is bringing spirited bidding in many cases and higher prices than the first sale, it was learned this week.
