## Quick CHICKEN PIE with Sweet Potato Biscuit Cover

A new one I have been trying out lately is thick with sweet young carrots and celery in a special gravy made of condensed chicken noodle soup. This gravy has that rich yellow chicken color. It is rich in chicken flavor. I will leave the pieces of chicken meat. Topping the pie are biscuits made with mashed sweet potatoes. It's a lovely dish—and a quick one! This is how it goes:

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 3 tablespoons flour
- 1 can condensed chicken noodle soup
- 1 cup water
- 1/2 cup cooked celery
- 1/2 cup cooked carrots
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- Melt the butter. Add the flour and blend thoroughly. Add the chicken noodle soup and water and cook until thickened. Add the cooked celery, cooked carrots and lemon juice. Put into a casserole dish and cover with "Sweet Potato Biscuits." Serve hot.
