Another Sewer Project Is OK'd

Hearing was held Tuesday night on the proposed sewer for Yosemite road, and approval was given by the City Commission. About a dozen interested persons were present. None was outspoken in objection to the project.

Another line to be built in the alley at the rear of the lots facing East Maple, to serve these lots. This cost has been estimated at \$13,800, a figure which may be cut as much as 40 per cent if WPA labor is used.

Assessments will be made at the rate of \$6.07 per thousand square feet of area, and \$1.02 a front foot. A sewer on Villa road, nearby, has already been started.

Development of this area has always been held back by poor sewer facilities. City Manager Egbert declared, "We have had several requests for this work."

A final hearing on the assessment roll will be held in about three weeks.
