I've Changed A Few Notions

Mexico, folks, is a friendly country, as you know, and I brought along a small portable radio; when we were settled here I found it in that vicinity and what you think was the first song, and the exact words that I heard over it. Nothing else but "south of the border, down Mexico way." The very next tune sung was "Oh, Johnny," and I kidded son, John, a bit about his chances with Mexican señoritas.

If you take the same route down here that we did, you will cross into Mexico at Laredo, Texas. It required about an hour to make the crossing, passing immigration and custom inspection. The Mexican authorities are really nice. Now Laredo is located just across from the Texas Laredo, and right away you get your first impression of the strange border. Negro Laredo is not interesting from an architectural standpoint; its buildings, once colorful—as is so typical of Latin countries—are now faded; its downtown streets are littered with the warms and the passive persons of old and young; and then you begin to get an impression of Mexico that, after all, doesn't do it justice. There are two sides to this country of nearly 200 million of people; there is the Indian side, with its apparent illiteracy and poverty and burden upon dark-skinned men and women, boys and girls, trudging or riding along the side of the highway with their animal everpresent burros; this is the side of Mexico that you live a thousand years ago. Then there is the highly civilized life of the better Mexican, the descendant of the conquering Spaniard, that began with Cortes in 1519. This side is the cultured side of today's Mexico—the side that, with the help of a few of the intelligent leaders developed among the Indians, is destined to make Mexico an important neighbor and factor in our own American future.
