

Northlawn Sewer And Water Needs A Puzzle to City

How to put in water and sewer sidelane drive, which is part of the western limit of the city, and satisfy all the property owners affected is a problem now before the City Commission.

Monday night, the matter was discussed, and at least one fact was agreed on: that a sewer should be built to do away with a septic tank effluent which now flows onto part of the Birmingham golf club.

Another factor which complicates the problem is the promise made several years ago to put in a gravel lane around the edges of the water works property so that interior lots would be served.

City Manager Egbert figured out five possible ways of doing the job, and submitted them to the property owners for their vote. The replies were varied, although a majority favored a plan which entailed an extra contribution by the city at large, but also the abandonment of the gravel road.

Finally, Egbert was instructed to go ahead with plan No. 4, and those who the property affected voted for it. Plan No. 4 entails a sewer costing \$7,711.05 on the part of the property owners and \$4,634.85 on the part of the city at large; and a water main to cost the property owners \$3,050.21 and the city at large \$1,524.54. All these costs would be diminished by savings made with WPA labor.

If many objections raised, improvements may be postponed indefinitely.
