What Is Communism?

"Communism may not be practical, but it is a noble ideal." How frequently one hears this compliment.

It would be equally correct to say, "Communism is practicable, but it is not ideal."

For communism means many things.

It may mean, for example, that one voluntarily works for the common good and asks for himself only what he needs for maintaining his efficiency.

This is the ideal which has been set forth by the world's great religions and moral teachers; and it is a way of life which has always been more or less followed by good men and women. It is the general rule among happy families. It is seen in the practices of hospitality and philanthropy. It is the way of their lives in so far as they devote their lives and their fortunes to productive enterprises.

It is not the communism of Karl Marx, Lenin, Trotsky, Stalin or Earl Browder. Marxian Communism is a political program is coercive. It proposes force upon the policeman's club and the soldier's bayonet. It begins by stealing the property of those who have it, and it ends by enslaving the minds and bodies of all the people.

Now this coercive communism is "practical" in the sense that it can be put into effect, either by degrees or all at once. It is not, however, a praiseworthy ideal, since it can only result in degenerate institutions and a degenerate people. For, no matter how lofty the initial aims, moral degeneration always sets in as soon as men try to rule their fellows by whips, clubs or machine guns.
