Need Birth Record For Payment of Old-Age Benefits

Documentary evidence of a person's age, ranging from a birth certificate to a license to drive an automobile, is going to have an increasing importance as the Federal Government's old-age and survivors insurance program develops according to Richard H. Hendrick, manager of the Social Security Board's field office at Pontiac. Hendrick explained that the Government will insist upon the proof of one's declaration of age before insurance payments are made. The law provides that monthly payments may be made to workers who have reached the age of 65 if they qualify, but, Hendrick asserted, it will accept no license as evidence as to age.

Similarly, the age of a worker's wife or widow or of his children will be proved by the fact that he can receive any of the supplementary benefits provided under the revised Social Security Act. "But a claimant will be given every opportunity," Hendrick said, "to supply the required proof. The burden of proof will be asked if he has a birth certificate. As a matter of fact, birth certificates of persons now 65 years old or more are comparatively scarce. In only eight states and the District of Columbia had the practice of keeping birth certificates been adopted before 1874. The District of Columbia began the keeping of such records in 1874; Florida in 1885; Massachusetts in 1890; Michigan in 1897; New Hampshire in 1840; New Jersey in 1848; Rhode Island in 1853; Vermont in 1857; and Virginia in 1855.

Hendrick added that in the event an applicant is unable to produce a birth certificate or a church record, such as the baptismal record, he may submit the statements of the pastor or midwife with personal knowledge of his birth. But recognizing that this type of evidence is in most cases as unavailable to a man of 65 as a birth certificate or a baptismal record, the Board's representative will suggest that he turn to the old family Bible. He may find there an account of those ornately engraved pages designed for the recording of family records, the date and place of his birth.

"If, however, it becomes evident that no account can be kept of a birth certificate, a church record or similar document," Hendrick added, "it may submit the statements of two other persons who have personal knowledge that he was born on a certain date, but since such persons will be even older than the claimant, the obtaining of this evidence is admittedly difficult. If it cannot be produced, the Board will open the way to the presentation of a miscellaneous lot of evidence, which when viewed as a whole, may be regarded as sufficient. This type of evidence will include public documents of varying nature, such as a man's army discharge, school records, or marriage certificates."

Rubber Mat Agent Sought by Police After Complaints

A man said to be representing himself as an agent of the Industrial Blind concern of Highland Park is being sought by Birmingham Police. Two complaints have been received relative to the man's selling rubber mats. One of the complainants, Mrs. Robert Hirsch, of 1189 Lakeside drive, whose first husband died, said she had been told by the man that he had been ordered and that \$2.50 was due him for the mats. Mrs. Hirsch then called the blind organization, which denied having a salesman working there. A Mrs. Root, 912 Westwood, whose first name the police did not obtain, also made a complaint. The man was described as being heavy set and wearing a gray suit and dark overcoat.
