Wayne University Described to Club

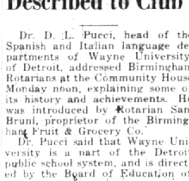

Dr. Pucci said that Wayne University is a part of the Detroit public school system, and is directed by the Board of Education.

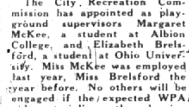
2 Supervisors Engaged

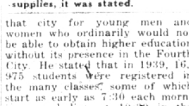

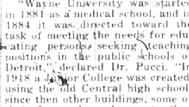
